

# 3. Pneumatology from a Pauline Theological Perspective

## 1. Introduction: The Central Role of the Holy Spirit in Pauline Theology

- 1) For Paul, the Holy Spirit is central to the identity and life of the believer.
  - 2) The Spirit plays a crucial role in the application of the gospel and salvation, the formation of the church, and the sanctification of the saints.
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## 2. The Spirit and Salvation

### 1) Regeneration:

The Spirit gives life to those who believe (Romans 8:2; Titus 3:5).

### 2) Sealing:

The Spirit seals believers, marking them as God's possession (Eph 1:13–14).

### 3) Guarantee:

The Spirit is the guarantee of the future inheritance and the fulfillment of salvation (2 Corinthians 1:22; 5:5).

### 1) Leading:

### 3) Freedom:

### 1) Unity in One Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:13):

Jews and Gentiles, slaves and free are baptized into one body.

### 2) Spiritual Gifts:

The Spirit distributes diverse gifts to each believer for the building up of the church (Romans 12:6–8; 1 Corinthians 12).

### 3) Fruit of the Spirit:

The inward work of the Spirit results in personal transformation (Galatians 5:22–23).

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## 5. The Spirit and Eschatology

### 1) Firstfruits:

The Spirit is a foretaste of the coming Kingdom of God (Rom 8:23)

### 2) Hope of Glory:

The Spirit enables believers to hope for future glory and full redemption (Romans 5:5; 2 Corinthians 5:5).

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## 6. Distinctives of Pauline Pneumatology

Category	Description
Christ-Centered	The Spirit testifies to and glorifies Christ
Community-Oriented	The Spirit's work is directed toward building the church
Ethical in Nature	The Spirit empowers believers for holy living
Eschatological Tension	The Spirit sustains the “already-not yet” tension of salvation
