- (1) A necessary process for improving research

- (1) Record and categorize all feedback.
- (2) Address recurring issues first.
- (3) Ask the advisor if any comments are unclear.

#### 6) Effective Revision Strategies

- (1) Revise while maintaining the core argument of the paper.
- (2) Strengthen the logical flow.
- (3) Remove unnecessary content and add missing explanations.

#### 7) Steps in the Revision Process

- (1) Organize feedback
- (2) Develop a revision plan
- (3) Revise the paper
- (4) Review and proofread
